#### HOLIDAY PACKAGES-SAFETY TIPS FROM THE U.S. POSTAL SERVICE

BRING IN YOUR PACKAGES BEFORE THEY DISAPPEAR

This is the time of year when deliveries left at your front door could find themselves in other hands. There are ways to protect yourself.

According to the United States Postal Service, this is the time of year when packages left behind by delivery services and even the local mailman often disappear. In various cities there have been reports of packages being stolen from the homes of people waiting for them.

The U.S. Postal Service reports it is geared up and ready for a projected 365 million holiday packages this year, a 20 percent increase over last year.

It offers these four tips to help you protect yourself and your packages:

- 1. Ask a friend of family member to pick up the pending packages.
  - 2. Ask the company delivering the package to hold it at the post office or delivery center.
    - 3. Have packages delivered at your place of work
    - // 4. Do not leave packages out for a lengthy amount of time; pick them up as soon as possible should you choose to leave them at the front door.

Heat oven to 350°F. Line cookie sheet with parchment paper or foil.

### **Holiday Safety**

# Be Safe when it comes to shopping and keep thieves from spoiling your holiday cheer

The holidays are the season for giving gifts to family and friends. Make sure you don't wind up giving your gifts to thieves instead. Shoppers this time of year often fall victim to theft and robbery. But, if you're careful and follow a few common-sense rules, you can protect yourself and your purchases.

The Department of Consumer Affairs Bureau of Security and Investigative Services (BSIS) offers the following advice to shoppers:

- Don't linger in the parking lot of a store or mall.
- Before entering a store, make a mental note of where you're
  parked and which entrance and exit you'll use. When you're ready
  to leave, get your car keys out before you exit the building, and
  quickly store your purchases out of sight, preferably in the trunk.
- Be aware of your surroundings: Think safe, be safe.
- Keep purses and wallets close at hand. Whenever possible, use breast pockets in jackets or front pockets in pants to store keys or money. Keep an eye on your credit cards: Make sure you get them back from cashiers. Remember, they are very busy this time of year.
- If you are the victim of a theft or some other crime, look for one of the uniformed security guards that usually patrol the mall. They are trained to act quickly to protect consumers, notify authorities and collect information that may help police catch suspects. If no uniformed guards are around, contact a store employee or go to the mall's information booth to report the incident.
- If you use a home security system or a security patrol company, the holiday season is a good time to reacquaint yourself and your family with those pertinent procedures and telephone numbers.
- If you put gifts under a tree at home, keep nearby windows closed and drapes or blinds shut at night or when no one is at home.

#### **Oatmeal Cookies**

Yield: 72 cookies

Ingredients

3 eggs, well beaten

I cup raisins

I teaspoon vanillas

I cup butter

I cup brown sugar

I cup white sugar

2 1/2 cups flour

I teaspoon salt

I teaspoon cinnamon

2 teaspoons baking soda

2 cups oatmeal

3/4 cup chopped pecans, optional

#### **Directions**

This is a very important first step that makes the cookie: combine eggs, raisins and vanilla and let stand for one hour.

Cream together butter and sugars.

Add flour, salt, cinnamon and soda and mix well.

Blend in egg-raisin mixture, oatmeal, and chopped nuts.

Dough will be stiff.

Drop by heaping teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet, or roll into balls and flatten slightly.

Bake at 350 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly browned.

### **Block Parties**

While the Board of Directors encourages everyone to attend the annual Chandler Crossing community event each Spring, they also understand that portions of the community may want to hold smaller gatherings on their own street. Therefore, the Board has set aside \$1,000 for this purpose with the following parameters: The association will reimburse up to \$200 per party and only one each 12 months per group. In addition, each group must follow the City of Chandler's rules to block off a street with barricades. Reimbursement will only cover food, non-alcoholic beverages, and entertainment such as
